#### **Introduction**

Much of the book of Leviticus deals with living a holy life. As was mentioned in the introduction to this study, one of the key themes of the book is found in Lev 19:2, "You shall be holy, for I the LORD your God am holy." The Law taught the people how to be holy, set apart, consecrated, pure, clean, and free from sin. The Israelites were not to live like the nations that surrounded them.

The laws and regulations kept God's holiness and sovereignty in front to the people, served as a constant reminder of the people's need to be holy.
